MBA (ABM) PROGRAMME AT A GLANCE

University of Agricultural Sciences, Bangalore was inaugurated by Dr. Zakir Hussain, the then Vice President of India on 21st August, 1964 in the august presence of Mr. Chester Bowles, the then US Ambassador to India and Sri S. Nijalingappa, the then Chief Minister. In 1969, Smt. Indira Gandhi, the then Prime Minister, inaugurated the GKVK campus on 12th July. University of Agricultural Sciences, Bangalore has entered in to MoU with several National and International reputed Organizations/Universities, to have a better interface with Industry and Institutions and also to help the Post-Graduate students in their future careers in academics, research and extension. The students of Master's Programmes graduating from the University are making better use of their expertise for the improvement of the living standards of farmers as well as in the overall development of agriculture.

In India, Agricultural Development is one of the most powerful tools to end extreme poverty, boost shared prosperity and feed 1.42 billion people. Since independence, a landmark agricultural revolution has transformed the nation from chronic dependence on grain imports into an agricultural power house that is now a net exporter of food.

The Agriculture Industry has radically transformed over the past 50 years. India's agriculture has seen a paradigm shift since independence due to rapidly changing and highly volatile markets, digital technology and a consumer-focused world, creating big opportunities in the field of Agribusiness. Technology has played an important role in developing the farming industry and improving agribusiness. Advances in farm machinery have expanded the scale and speed of their utilization and their adoption leading to more efficient cultivation of land.

Agribusiness has to be seen not just as economically important, but also as a critical part of society. Agribusiness is growing and evolving into a technology and market driven industry, extending from primary production to value addition, service orientation and market linkages. As such, successful Agribusiness Management requires a special set of skills, expertise, and acumen, quite different from conventional business management. Agribusiness Management (ABM) education plays a crucial role in providing quality human resource to the industry. It is with this realization and the long-felt need to establish a model institution of excellence in Agribusiness Management, University of Agricultural Sciences, Bangalore began to offer MBA (ABM) programme from the academic year 2007-08 in Bengaluru, the Silicon City of India.

The MBA (ABM) programme offered by UAS (B) under the Institute of Agri-Business Management is designed to equip students with training, knowledge and professional skills to work in the fields of Agribusiness and emphasizes the multifaceted development of the students as well as to inculcate the values of team work and integrity. The curriculum of MBA (ABM) is designed to help the students to develop and nurture their decision-making skills, ignite managerial spark from within, harness the managerial capabilities for facing a variety of business situations, efficiently and effectively.

A variety of courses are offered with specialization in Managerial Accounting, Marketing management, Finance, Human Resource Management, Banking, Retail Management, Quantitative Techniques, Managerial Economics, Econometrics etc., along with Agribusiness Interface in the form of Project Work (in two semesters) and summer placement. The curricula of MBA (Agribusiness Management) programme has been revised from time to time to meet the ever-changing needs of the Agribusiness Industry. The University has adopted the syllabus as per BSMA recommendations (approved by ICAR, New Delhi) for MBA (ABM) programme from the academic year 2022-23.

The programme is offered by experienced UAS (B) faculty and expert faculty (from reputed Management Schools) and Industry Experts, who bring their experience into the classroom, providing relevant examples and case studies. Since its inception, around 325 MBA (ABM) students are graduated and are employed in diverse fields of Agribusiness, Retail Marketing, Food Processing and Food Production, ICT and other domains. The Institute has a separate placement cell since 2007-08 which has facilitated jobs for over 270 MBA (ABM) graduates in leading public and private organizations/institutions/companies and also in Multinational Companies.

Project work in Agribusiness and Food Business Management has become an important component of MBA (ABM) programme. Research areas of the students cover Marketing Infrastructure, Price Forecasting, Consumer Preference, Production and Marketing Management, Business Performance, Value Chain Analysis, Market Dynamics, Agricultural Finance, Export Business in Agriculture, Market Integration, Agribusiness Apprisal, Organic Farming, Contract Farming, Futures Trade, Online Trade of Farm Products, Retail Management etc.

1.0 MASTER OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (AGRIBUSINESS MANAGEMENT) DEGREE PROGRAMME

The University offers Master of Business Administration (ABM) at GKVK, Bengaluru only.

In general, intake for the MBA (ABM) has been around 34 students excluding the students admitted under ICAR quota.

1.1 ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS FOR MBA (ABM) PROGRAMME

- 1. Candidates seeking admission to MBA (ABM) programme in the University shall possess Bachelor Degree of four years from any of the SAU's /Deemed Universities /ICAR Accredited Institutions/ Institutions recognized by ICAR, New Delhi with a minimum OGPA of 5.50 /10.00. In the case of SC/ST/Cat-I, the minimum OGPA required is 5.00 /10.00.
- 2. Candidates seeking admission for MBA (ABM) should apply in the prescribed application form only. Application and Prospectus can be downloaded from the University website (www.uasbangalore.edu.in)
- **3.** Eligible candidates are required to appear for the Written Entrance Examination at GKVK campus for 100 marks, which includes to the extent of 60 % questions comprising Knowledge on Agricultural Technology (KAT) & 40 % on Management Aptitude Test (MAT) and should secure a minimum of 40 % (35 per cent in the case of SC/ST and Cat-I) to qualify for Group Discussion & Interview.

DOMICILE REQUIREMENT

4. Candidate should have studied for a minimum period of seven academic years in any educational institution in Karnataka State at any time upto Bachelor's degree as on October, 2022.

1.2 MODE OF ADMISSION

All the eligible candidates will have to appear for the Written Entrance Examination on the scheduled date. The Admit Card (Candidates copy) attached along with the application needs to be produced on the day of examination.

Merit will be determined by assigning 30 % weightage to UG academic performance, 50 % to written entrance examination, 10 % to group discussion & 10 % to interview. The candidate should secure a minimum of 50% (35 per cent in the case of SC/ST & Cat-I) to become eligible for admission.

- 1. Candidates who have qualified in the Written Entrance Examination will be called for Group Discussion and Interview in the ratio of 1:3
- 2. Merit will be determined based on the weightage of marks scored in the items provided in Table 1.
- 3. The above weightage of marks will be considered for admission only.

There will be no counselling for MBA (ABM) Programme. A common merit list will be prepared and notified. The Admission Committee will allot the seats based on merit and reservation policy in force. The unfilled seats, if any, will be allotted as per the merit list.

The Selection List will be uploaded on the University Website for the information of applicants. The selected candidates have to report to Registrar and register for the course at the office of the Registrar on or before 26.12.2022 the specified date for the purpose, along with the original documents and pay the prescribed fees.

1.3 FEES FOR MBA (ABM) DEGREE PROGRAMME

The fees payable by the provisionally selected candidates for MBA (ABM) programme at the time of admission to the first semester and subsequent semesters / years is provided in **Annexure – I.**

1.4 SEAT MATRIX FOR MBA (ABM) DEGREE PROGRAMME

Five seats over and above the 25 seats are reserved for Candidates from All India quota with Institutional Economic Fee as mentioned in the fee structure. (Sl. No.23 in Annexure-I).

(a) The Seat Matrix for MBA (ABM) Degree Programme, categorywise is provided in Annexure -II.

(b) RESERVATION OF SEATS

Reservation of seats for SC/ST & OBCs

- 1) Reservation of seats in favour of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes will be in accordance with the reservation policy stipulated by the Government of Karnataka from time to time. (G.O. No. SWD 225 BOA 2000 dated 30th March, 2002; new comprehensive creamy layer policy).
- 2) If seats belonging to any of the Categories referred to above are not filled due to non-availability of eligible candidates, the reservation to that extent shall stand reduced and shall be transferred to the General Merit category as per the G.O. No. ED/47 /TEC/97 dated 3.5.97.

(c) Reservation for specially – abled candidates

Five per cent of the seats are reserved for specially - abled candidates over and above the prescribed seat matrix for MBA (ABM) degree programme. The applicant should enclose copy of the medical certificate issued by the competent authority and produce the original at the time of admission.

(d) One seat for Sports / Games / Cultural / NSS activities

One seat for MBA (ABM) is reserved for students who have excelled in Sports / Games / Cultural and NSS activities during their undergraduate programme based on merit.

- (e) 1. Eight per cent of the seats are available in MBA (ABM) degree programme referred to in the Second Schedule be allocated among the local candidates of Kalyan-Karnataka region.
 - 2. While determining under sub-paragraph (1), number of seats to be reserved in favour of the local person, any fraction of a seat shall be counted as one, provided that there shall be at least one unreserved seat.
 - 3. While allocating under sub-paragraph (1), reserved seats among the local persons in relation to the local areas, fractions of a seat shall be adjusted by counting the greatest fractions as one and if necessary, also the greater of the remaining fractions as another, and where the fraction to be so counted cannot be selected by reason of the fractions being equal, the selection shall be by lot, provided that there shall be at least one seat allocated for the local persons in respect of the local area.

Filling of reserved vacant seats

If a local person is not available to fill any seats reserved or allocated in favour of local person in respect of that local area, such seat shall be filled as if it has not been reserved.

Local Area

The part of the State called Kalyan-Karnataka Region comprising the districts of Bidar, Kalaburgi, Yadgir, Raichur, Koppal, Vijayanagara and Ballari shall be regarded as the local area for the purpose of admission in the University.

The Kalyan-Karnataka region students should produce the relevant documents from the competent authority (vide GO Order No. DPAR 06 PLX 2012, Bengaluru dated.06.11.2013).

1.5 DURATION, MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION, SYSTEM OF EDUCATION OF MBA (ABM) DEGREE PROGRAMME

A minimum of two academic years (4 Semesters) shall be required for the completion of course work, summer placement / Project work preparation and examinations leading to the award of MBA (ABM) degree.

System of Education & Medium of Instruction

The MBA (ABM) degree Programme is taught under semester system in English medium only.

2.0 GENERAL ADMISSION

The provisionally selected candidates for MBA (ABM) Programme shall pay the prescribed fee on or before the last date specified and seek admission. The Payment shall be made through Demand Draft (DD) drawn in favour of **Comptroller**, **UAS**, **Bangalore**.

2.1 ADMISSION OF FOREIGN NATIONALS

Foreign Nationals eligible to seek admission to MBA (ABM) programmes at UAS, GKVK, Bengaluru are required to submit the Application (CV Biodata & attested copies of educational documents & Passport) through Secretary, DARE, Krishi Bhavan, New Delhi - 110 011. INDIA / Asst. Director General, HRD - I, ICAR, Krishi Anusandhan Bhavan, New Delhi - 110 012, INDIA, through the respective Embassy or The Government concerned of the Country to the Registrar, UAS, Bangalore. The Selected Candidate is required to pay US Dollars (\$) 4000 per annum as Institutional Economic Fees apart from the prescribed fee for the semesters and also group health insurance. However, candidates of SAARC countries have to pay US Dollars (\$) 2000 per annum as Institutional Economic Fee, besides the prescribed fee and also group health insurance.

2.2 REGISTRATION

Candidates admitted to MBA (ABM) degree programme after paying the prescribed fees shall report to the Professor & Head, Institute of Agribusiness Management GKVK for advise on the courses that are to be registered and complete the process of registration on or before the date of commencement of the I Semester of 2022-23, so as to place them on the rolls of the University.

3.0 HOSTEL FACILITIES

The GKVK campus has separate hostels for boys, girls and also to International students. The hostel facilities shall be provided at the campus to the extent available on first-cum-first serve basis. The students who desire to reside in the hostel shall obtain the application form from the hostel concerned on the day of admission. Duly filled-in application form for admission to the hostel should be submitted to the hostel warden concerned well in advance for allotment of accommodation. The hostel rooms are provided with cots and working tables. The boarder should make arrangement for bedding. On allotment of a room, the candidate should pay the prescribed fees and seek admission as per the university norms & guidelines.

4.0 SCHOLARSHIPS

- 1. University Resident Merit Scholarship (URMS) shall be awarded to admitted candidates during each academic year and will be restricted to those students who have graduated from the farm universities in Karnataka. One scholarship shall be awarded for every ten students or part thereof. Students from other State Agricultural Universities/ State Departments and candidates who have been sponsored or drawing salary are not eligible for URMS.
- 2. All eligible SC/ST students are required to compulsorily apply for Government of India scholarship and students of other categories who are eligible are required to apply for fee concession.

INSTRUCTION TO CANDIDATES

Application & Information Bulletin may be downloaded from the University Website www.uasbangalore.edu.in during the period from 23.11.2022 to 07.12.2022. The applicant/candidate should go through the information bulletin carefully before filling the application. Before submitting the application, care must be taken for payment of the application fee (Rs.2000/- GM / OBC and Rs. 1000/- SC/ST/Cat-I Candidates) through the bank draft drawn in favour of COMPTROLLER, UAS, BANGALORE, payable at Bangalore. The last date for submission of application is 07.12.2022. (Ref. page No.6.)

- No separate Intimation letter will be sent to Candidates regarding the date / time of Entrance Examination.
- The results of the Entrance Examination will be notified / hosted in the University website and merit list will be hosted in the University website as scheduled. (Ref. to The Scheduled Calendar of events on page 6 for confirmation).
- The information / particulars furnished by the candidates in his/her application form shall be final.
- Submission of any documents / certificates will not be entertained once the application is received in the Registrar's office.
- All certificates produced to claim the reservations must be valid and dated on or before
 the last date prescribed for the submission of application form i.e., 07.12.2022.
- Before submitting the filled in application form, the candidates are required to secure a photocopy of the same for reference / correspondence.
- Candidate belonging to any of the Reserved Categories should submit the Caste/Income certificate (after 1st April, 2022), as the case may be, issued by the Tahsildar in Form-D for SC/ST, Form–E for CAT-I and Form-F for 2A, 2B, 3A & 3B Categories.
- The filled-in-application forms should be complete in all respects including submission of copies of the transcripts/marks card/ certificates etc., as on the date of submission.
- Candidates are required to appear for Written Entrance Examination / Group Discussion & Interview (MBA) at their own cost.
- The candidates are required to be present at the venue of Written Entrance
 Examination / Group Discussion and Interview one hour before the beginning of the
 Examination.
- Admission to the Written Entrance Examination is subject to fulfillment of eligibility conditions prescribed and production of attested photo identity card.
- The list of eligible candidates for Written Test/Group Discussion/ Interview will be notified on the University Website. Further, no separate intimation will be sent to the students related to Written Entrance Examination/ Group Discussion and Interview.
- Production of all original transcripts or marks cards and all relevant certificates during
 Group Discussion/Interview and at the time of admission for verification is mandatory.

- The selected candidates are requested to produce Proof of Payment (Transaction ID) for payment made to **Comptroller**, **UAS**, **Bangalore** as indicated in the fee structure at the time of admission.
- Students belonging to SC/ ST who are eligible for concession are required to pay fees which are not reimbursable by the Government as per G.O. No. SWL 229 BCA 80 dated 16-12-1982 and as amended from time to time. Candidates must produce two photocopies of caste certificate to claim concession of fees.
 - All fees indicated in the Information Bulletin are subject to change with the approval of the University.
 - Caution Money is refundable only after successful completion of the MBA (ABM)
 degree programme for which candidate is admitted or on discontinuing the degree
 programme on his/her request. The student shall claim the caution money after
 furnishing No Dues Certificate from all the concerned, after due notification by the
 Registrar.
 - An admission/application fee once paid by the student is non-refundable, except Caution Money deposit.
 - Failure to pay the prescribed fees on the stipulated date will result in forfeiting the admission
 - The admission is subject to fulfilment of all the eligibility conditions prescribed as per UAS (B) rules/statutes/Government Orders.
 - Any change in the Schedule of Events will be announced on the University website as a News Brief. No separate intimation will be sent to the candidates.
 - If the information furnished by the candidate in the application form and / or any other documents submitted by the candidate is are found to be false or incorrect, the admission will be cancelled at any point of time during his / her course of study and appropriate legal proceedings will be initiated against the student.
